

Kids Against Hunger Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Exactly what will we be doing?

A. We will be combining dried ingredients into bags to make meals. Thousands of these highly nutritious meals will be shipped to the victims of the earthquake in Haiti.

Q. When will this happen and how long will it last?

A. On Sunday, March 7, we will start the first teams at 11:00 AM and teams will start on the hour every hour after that. The last teams will begin at 4:00 PM. Most people/teams sign up for a single, one hour slot.

Q. What are these “teams”?

A. It takes 12 people (a team) in an assembly line fashion to efficiently package these meals.

Q. I don't know 11 other people that I could ask to be on a team. Can I still participate?

A. Since it takes 12 people to create one line, we are encouraging the formation of teams. For those who need to sign up as an individual, we will do our best to match you with a team who needs one or two more. We will find a place for you.

Q. I'd like for my kids to help. Is there an age limit?

A. Typically, kids middle school and older need very little, if any, supervision. Younger than middle school, we recommend an adult for every child. The minimum age is really up to parents. You know your kids best. This is a fun project and we definitely encourage kids to participate.

Q. How much does all of this cost?

A. The cost is 25 cents per serving. Each team will package roughly 2,000 meals in one hour, which amounts to \$500. If each of the 12 team members contributes at least \$42, this will cover the cost of the meals that they package.

Q. I cannot participate on March 7th. Can I still contribute?

A. Yes. You can drop a check in the offering, payable to Calvary Church, and in the memo line write, “KAH” or “Kids Against Hunger”.

Q. What if I can't contribute \$42 or my team can't raise \$500?

A. This effort will be entirely funded through individual gifts. We would ask that you give what you can. We understand that in some cases, circumstances may not allow a gift for the recommended amount. We also ask that everyone consider giving sacrificially. Proverbs 3:9 tells us that God requires the first and best we have to give. As a thought to challenge perspective, consider giving a gift equal to your cell phone bill last month. Is it worth the price of nationwide long distance and unlimited texting to save lives in Haiti?

Q. I've heard about a “food challenge.” What is that?

A. The week before March 7 we will encourage everyone to experience a “subsistence diet” and get an idea of what this is like for many in our world. And it can raise funds for KAH!

Q. I have a question that is not on this list. Who can answer that for me?
